MM: The host of WTF, comedian Marc Maron.


WHAT IS IT ABOUT THE FORMAT OF PODCASTING THAT FIRST ATTRACTED YOU, AND WHAT KEEPS YOU MOTIVATED?

The freedom of the medium. I never know what is going to happen during any

conversation, ever. It's also a major part of my social life.

WHAT'S A PODCAST?!



A QUICK RUN DOWN ON WHAT A PODCAST ACTUALLY IS AND HOW YOU CAN START LISTENING!

A podcast is a digital audio file made available on the internet for downloading or streaming to a computer or an alternative device such as a phone. To be a little less clinical, it's essentially a radio show that you can listen to wherever and whenever you choose without being interrupted by regular weather bulletins or travel updates.



Right now there are over 2.4 million different podcasts with over 66 million episodes in 100 different languages available to listen to. These range from highly produced shows recorded in professional studios by major broadcasters to rough and ready homemade shows recorded on a laptop in someone's bedroom. If you have a phone or a computer and an internet connection, you can make a podcast, making it one of the most democratic mediums around. Is it time to see what all the fuss is about?

HOW MUCH DO THEY COST?

Nothing! They're absolutely free which makes them one of the most accessible forms of entertainment around. Many of the larger podcasts will feature adverts and some offer access to extra content for a small fee but 99% of podcasts are available for you to listen to on demand for nothing at all.

There are literally millions of hours of top quality content out there for you to explore -so what's stopping you?!

SO HOW DO I LISTEN?

If you're an iPhone user then the Apple Podcasts app should already be on your phone. The same applies for the Google Podcasts app on Android phones. Within these apps you can search for and follow shows so that the latest episodes will be downloaded to your phone without you having to seek them out.

If you have a Spotify account you can use it to listen to the majority of podcasts, including shows that are exclusive to the platform. The Audible app can be used to listen to Audible original podcasts. There are a number of other podcast apps available to download such as our personal recommendation, Pocket Casts.

If you're on a desktop computer then you can use the Spotify desktop application (which is also available in your browser) the Acast website or the Audible Cloud Player. Alternatively you can use iTunes or go direct to the website of the podcast you want to listen to.

Finally, you can use your home smart speakers as a way to listen too. Just ask them to play you a podcast and go from there!

BOOTS, BALLS & BRAS - ON A RECORD BREAKING YEAR FOR WOMEN'S FOOTBALL

We sat down with two of the hosts from Women's Football Podcast Boots, Balls & Bras - Eartha Pond and Bex Smith to chat starting their podcast and success of women's football this year.

EARTHA: I've always had 'doing a Podcast' on my 'To Do List' and wanted to start recording

during the Euros (with the spotlight on Women's Football in mind). However, post retiring Fara Williams (the third host) also expressed an interest in doing a podcast and she never stops talking - so it was a natural fit! Bex Smith is a player I've got to know off the pitch and also has similar passion for the game. Bex already

has a portfolio around the game and great social commentary so it was a no brainer to get her as part of the dream team.

BEX: Yeah, after hosting *The Players Podcast* I was looking for different ways to drive conversation with my own take on the game

in a broader and more unique kind of way. The initial reaction has been overwhelmingly positive. Because the topics are not just 'scores' and 'game analysis' but touch on broader topics that anyone can relate to, we've received really positive feedback from non-traditional women's football fans. And that's the aim.

EARTHA: The main challenge we have found starting the pod I'd say, is scheduling time to physically be together to talk football and social issues, purely because we are all aspirational women in our own rights carving a career off the field now. However, long term goals are to continue having open and

honest conversations around the game and the impact it can have socially. Where we can support positive change, through voices heard via our platform resulting in action.

BEX: We wanted to make sure Boots, Balls & Bras is a podcast touching on global issues

and highlights in the game on and off the pitch. While there's a tendency to look at football here in England, we try to hit the big topics globally as well. For our Half Time Team Talks we wanted to discuss subjects that resonate with us as well such as player well being, Black

History Month, behaviour in the game etc. We're open to listeners' suggestions as well, since it's important to listen to our audience and those who don't have a platform to raise important topics.

INTRODUCING... STACKED

HOW DID THE IDEA FOR STACKED COME ABOUT?

We met up in a park during the pandemic and had a really good conversation about the books we were reading and just felt people could benefit from it because we did. This was at the point when *Mostly Lit* had ended and we felt a very palpable absence of a Black British perspective on books that we didn't notice or know we needed before they started. We felt there was a need within the industry for lesser-represented voices such as ours to share our thoughts, opinions and experiences. It has been amazing to witness the industry's endeavours to highlight and promote black marginalised voices through publishing more black authors. But it is

equally important to have black critics as conversations around art are elevated and enriched by perspectives that pick up the different ways it speaks to us – so we started Stricked

SINCE YOU FOUND OUT THAT YOU WON ACAST AMPLIFIER, WHAT HAS THE PODCAST CREATION JOURNEY BEEN LIKE?

Fast and furious. In less than a year we've applied, found out we won, created *Stacked* and launched. It feels a bit like an episode of 'Stars In Their Eyes' (90s babies will understand). We are total amateurs so everything has been new

and foreign, and we've had to learn quickly. It's also (fortunately) been a collaborative journey and we're so grateful to Acast, CC co and all the creatives they've partnered us with.

WHAT HAVE BEEN THE CHALLENGES WITH LAUNCHING STACKED?

Definitely the technical and business elements of launching a podcast, and having to manage everything with our day jobs – reading the books and recording the episodes on the other hand have been a breezel

WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO NEXT YEAR?

We're looking forward to wrapping our first season and hearing what people think. Community is one of the founding pillars of our podcast, so it'll be great to hand the mic over to our listeners and get a sense of their thoughts and feelings about the books we discuss in the first season. Funnily enough, more than anything, we really want to hear people's feedback on our book recommendations. We pride ourselves on those.

WHAT'S THE PLAN WITH STACKED?

We'd say that the plan is to build and strengthen an inclusive literary community where we can continue to share ideas with our audience and have interesting conversations about the books we've read and how they've impacted our lives. We want to change the face of what a 'reader' is or can be. We want to continue to platform writers that we believe have been underappreciated and overlooked, while insuring that the same doesn't happen to their contemporaries. And most of all, we want to have fun while we do it

BEHIND THE SCENES AT TORTOISE & THE SENSEMAKER PODCAST

Sensemaker's day begins at 9.30am when we have an editorial meeting where we discuss whether the story we have planned for the next day is the right one to be doing.

Once we've agreed on the story and what we're making sense of, a member of the *Sensemaker* team is commissioned to write it.

Sometimes we might interview someone so we have our own original material for the episode or we'll use publicly available news clips.

Once the script is written it is edited by the executive producer or another editor in the audio team signs it off.

Presenters Tomini or Claudia then record the episode in our studio and the producer will then get to work mixing it.

Once the final mix has been

listened to by the executive producer or another editor it is uploaded to Acast and for Tortoise members on our website, app and Tortoise Plus channel on Apple.

WITH **EStak.**

WHO - OR WHAT - WAS BEHIND THE INTERRUPTION?

45 YEARS AGO, A BRITISH NEWS PROGRAMME WAS INTERRUPTED BY AN ALIEN MESSAGE. NOBODY EVER CLAIMED RESPONSIBILITY, BUT A NEW PODCAST IS TRYING TO SOLVE THE MYSTERY.

On the 26th November 1977, Southern Television, a TV station located in the quiet Hampshire countryside, was having a day like any other. Five o'clock came and with it the early evening news bulletin. The reporter, lvor Mills, began as usual but then, all of a sudden, came a distortion. The sound of the reporter faded and a mysterious voice began

The individual identified itself as the alien 'Vrillon'. For six minutes, it delivered an urgent plea for all humankind to disarm their "weapons of evil" and bring about peace.

to speak.

Forty-five years later, it's become the obsession of internet conspiracy theorists, but no investigation - official or otherwise - has come close to finding the culprit. 'The Interruption', a new podcast from Stak, dives into this murky world of UFO religions and pirate radio to try and solve the 45-year-old cold case.

We sat down with host Tommie Trelawny to discuss the upcoming series.

WHAT DREW YOU TO THE SOUTHERN TELEVISION INTERRUPTION OF 1977?

The deep monotonous voice of "Vrillon" that broke onto British TV has been circulating online for a while now. The internet has allowed lost stories like these to resurface

Ever since I first heard the audio of the incident, it's been swirling around my mind. The intruder's bizarre message of peace, love, and flying saucers has so many unanswered questions surrounding it. No one was

caught and no one came forward. It's a mystery too intriguing to be left unsolved.

WHY DID YOU CHOOSE TO REOPEN THIS 45-YEAR-OLD COLD CASE IN THE FORM OF A PODCAST?

I don't think I officially "opened" this investigation. It's more a case of gradually falling down the rabbit hole. I suppose it began with a dusty Wikipedia article and



a few YouTube videos and then, all of a sudden, I'm trawling through archives, securing leads and finding suspects.

That, in essence, is the beauty of podcasting: it invites listeners into a deeper narrative. The listener gets to be part of the journey and experience the mystery unravelling it in real time.

WHAT WAS THE MOST UNEXPECTED THING (OR PERSON!) YOU CAME ACROSS THROUGHOUT THE INVESTIGATION?

I did not anticipate how much an investigator influences their investigation. My experiences, beliefs, and suspicions dictated where I searched, and who I talked to. All in subtle, unconscious ways. I guess I didn't quite understand what an "open mind" really meant.

Making the show took me to some surprising places. I visited the Aetherius Society (Britain's oldest UFO religion), infiltrated online groups, and even interviewed Vrillon themself with the help of a channeler.

The most unexpected encounter was with the celebrity illusionist Uri Geller. He was entangled in the investigation pretty early on. On a whim, I sent him an email asking for a comment. Later that day I was interviewing him on the phone. We still chat on WhatsApp every now and then.

FROM WHAT YOU KNOW NOW, WHAT DO YOU THINK IS THE RECIPE FOR AN INVESTIGATIVE PODCAST SUCCESS?

Leave no stone unturned.

IN EVERY ISSUE WE ASK A PODCAST DISCIPLE FIVE QUESTIONS ABOUT THEIR LOVE OF PODCASTS AND PODCASTING. FOR THIS ISSUE WE'RE JOINED BY **KEMAH BOB**, COMEDIAN, WRITER AND HOST OF THE **FOC IT UP** PODCAST!

WHY DO YOU LOVE PODCASTS?

I love podcasts for the autonomy they offer both consumers and creators. As a podcaster I appreciate the freedom to discuss what I want to, how I want to. My opinion isn't being held back by a board of trustees or behind walls of compliance. My creativity isn't held back by prescribed structure, or what people are used to listening to at 10 am.

I'm not saying people should go around saying and doing what they want without consequences. There's an old saying in the Black American community: f*ck around and find out. I just think the world is more fun when folks have the freedom to f*ck around.

WHAT WAS THE FIRST POD YOU EVER LISTENED TO?

The first podcast I had ever heard was WTF with Marc Maron. This was back in the day before I was a comedian, before I ever aspired to be a guest (pretty please Mr. Maron with a microphone on top). What delighted me about it was its simplicity and spirit. It was just a hilarious man talking to his guests about life, which often led to Marc using humour to navigate quite tender things. Not to be a wimp, but that's quite an important life skill.

WHICH PODCASTER MAKES YOU LAUGH THE MOST?

Oh, this is definitely a tie between Helen Bauer and Josh Jones. Listening to Helen and Josh makes me wonder if I've lived a life - because if I have then why don't I have a zillion incredible stories on tap? Listening to them makes me both concerned that childhood trauma has robbed me of my memory, and their safety Manjars, Helen can

concerned for their safety. Maniacs. Helen can be heard on her new pod *Trusty Hogs* and her old pod *Daddy Look at Me*, Josh can be heard on his new pod *Hard Sell* and his old new pod *Chatting with Cherubs*.

WHICH PODCAST HAS EDUCATED YOU THE MOST?



Hands down, *The Guilty Feminist* podcast. I don't think I truly understood what being a feminist meant before I encountered it. I knew how I felt, what I believed. I knew that something was wrong with Texas. I knew that there were forces working to hold women back and weigh us down, but I didn't have the language to express it.

I have had the privilege of co-hosting *The Guilty Feminist*, and sitting next to Deborah Francis-White over the past 4 years while we meet activists has taught me so much about myself and the world.

CAN YOU RECOMMEND A SHOW OUR READERS MAY NOT HAVE HEARD OF YET?

This Homecoming Podcast with Dr. Thema. Before I go on, I want you to know I do realize that none of these answers have been funny.

This one won't be either - it's gunna be sincere and earnest. For that I'm sorry.

The show's purpose is to "facilitate your journey home to yourself" using psychology, spirituality and artistic practice. I'm an incredibly spiritual person but you don't have to be to connect to this offering. You just need to be curious about yourself, your needs, your healing and living your (wait for it...) best life.

Over the past few years, when I've found myself feeling hurt, lost or far from myself, this podcast has been a beautiful resource. It features 30 minute episodes on topics ranging from addressing self abandonment, overcoming perfectionism, even dealing with racial trauma. It's an incredibly important resource and I'm honoured to recommend it.

JASON REED FROM LEAP UK & THE STOP AND SEARCH PODCAST SPEAKS TO THE PEOPLE BEHIND PODCASTS FROM THE CHARITY AND CAUSES SECTOR

What hasn't Andrew O'Neill done? An award-winning comedian, best-selling writer, and a musician, and now they're using their voice to raise awareness to the high street penumbra which society is yet to have a full conversation about: No Sweat is a podcast which casts an eye on the global issue of sweatshops and exploitation in the garment industry. With incredibly tough themes, Andrew still has an air of self-deprecation.

"Every stand-up comedian needs a podcast, right? It's the law now. If you don't have one, people come round your house at night and knock on your front door. I've been working on and off with the

organisation No Sweat for years, doing stand-up at their benefit gigs and helping to organise shows. One of their honchos (there is no head-honcho, it's a non-hierarchical organisation) Jay got in touch with the idea of using comedy as a way to communicate the issues that No Sweat deals with. My role is to ask the questions the audience would like

asked. I'm like Doctor Who's companion. Nav and Mayisha are the real activists, they have the information, they have the passion - and they conduct the interviews."

As a podcast which relies on social outreach and challenging the audience, what are the reactions for *No Sweat*?

"People are fascinated. We've been told the show is a great way to learn about the issues. That's definitely a big thing with campaigning against sweatshop labour - it's often seen as a sort of monolithic issue, impossible to fix, but the interviews we're doing with activists show that change is possible, it's

happening. It's incredibly inspiring. And it's cool that people are listening. The episode about the Justice For Jeyasre campaign is particularly moving. Jeyasre Kathiravel was an Indian Dalit woman garment worker and union member organising against genderbased violence and harassment at a major Indian garment manufacturer that supplies to

American and European fashion brands. She was murdered by her manager. Out of that tragedy, incredible women on the ground in the factories are organising, building hope and making real change."

As listeners, do we need to do more? And do we really understand what's being addressed?

"It's easy to feel (as I did, to be honest) that issues of labour exploitation and gender-based violence in the garment industry have been addressed. We all read 'No Logo'... we signed petitions... we've been made aware, and we've moved on. But that's unfortunately utter bollocks. I was pretty shocked to learn that NO high street clothes shop is free from sweatshop labour. Not one. We need to keep this stuff alive, in the forefront of people's minds."

With the need for creative outreach, *No Sweat* is going live! What can we expect to listen to in the future?

"First off we are doing a live show at the iconic 100 Club on Oxford Street. No Sweat has its origins in the punk scene, so it's a perfect fit. There will be stand-up and that, and we'll record a podcast live. Then we're going to try to raise our ambitions for our second series - more interviews, higher production values, utterly destroy capitalism."
